



## Powerstock CE VA Primary School Pupil Premium Report 2014-2015

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low income families who are eligible for free school meals, children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months and children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces. Its purpose is to address inequality, ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage and support emotional and social wellbeing reaches the pupils who need it most. Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium allocation as they see fit, and are held accountable for how they have used the funds.

At Powerstock School, we aim to ensure that

- Teaching and Learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils
- Pupil Premium funds are allocated following a needs analysis to ensure:
  - That the progress of the pupils who receive the pupil premium is at least in line with that of the other pupils in our care, and is in line or better than national expectations
  - Improved self-esteem, confidence and emotional stability
  - Improved participation in school based activities

At Powerstock Primary School, the Pupil Premium for 2014-2015 was £1267.00.

This Pupil Premium has been allocated as follows:

- To provide the opportunity for identified pupils to receive withdrawal 1:1 support for the teaching of reading, writing, spelling and maths skills.
- To provide further training and support to a Teaching Assistant in their in Emotional Literacy Support Role.
- To fund school trips to London and Bridport Leisure Centre
- To fund music provision for Pupil Premium children.
